Guidelines for Dispersal of Money Held by the Charitable Trust

- 1. The main focus is on projects that have the potential to assist young people.
- 2. Money is to be directed to organisations rather than individuals. The benefit of an individual, or a limited group of individuals, may be considered only in exceptional circumstances.
- 3. The prime focus is on the Greater Wellington area, although NZ wide organisations that have a Wellington connection may be considered.
- 4. Under the trust deed, money will very rarely be able to be spent on overseas projects.
- 5. The Trustees will endeavour to work with other Rotary Clubs within the Greater Wellington area if they have projects that qualify for assistance.
- 6. It is preferable to be able to make a small number of large grants than a large number of small ones.
- 7. Grants will usually be "one-off", with no continuing commitment by the Trust.
- 8. In considering an application for assistance the following questions are relevant:
 - 8.1 how beneficial is the project to the community as a whole?
 - 8.2 what other sources of funds are available?
 - 8.3 to what extent can the use of funds be adequately controlled by the recipient and monitored by RCWC?
 - 8.4 will any benefit be enduring or transitory?
 - 8.5 will the applicant(s) be deriving any personal benefit?
